RESOLUTION 01-14

RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE SECRETARY OF THE RESOURCES AGENCY AND THE DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION INCLUDE THE BALDWIN HILLS CONSERVANCY'S RECOMMENDED REVISIONS TO THE KENNETH HAHN STATE RECREATION AREA PRELIMINARY GENERAL PLAN IN THEIR SUBMISSION TO THE LEGISLATURE PURSUANT TO STATUTES OF 1999, CHAPTER 752

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Resources Agency and the Director of Parks and Recreation must submit to the Legislature a master plan for the expansion and development of Kenneth Hahn State Recreation Area in the Baldwin Hills.

WHEREAS, the Kenneth Hahn State Recreation Area Preliminary General Plan was created as the master plan for Baldwin Hills pursuant to Statutes of 1999, chapter 752, section 1(b).

WHEREAS, the community, local public agencies and the Conservancy have reviewed the Kenneth Hahn State Recreation Area Preliminary General Plan that was circulated publicly in September of 2001.

WHEREAS, the Conservancy has discussed the conceptual nature of the plan and has agreed to the following recommended revisions:

- 1) The plan should be re-titled the Baldwin Hills Park Master Plan to distinguish it from the general plan for existing parkland which the California Department of Parks and Recreation is now developing.
- 2) The Environmental Analysis section of the plan, pages 80-97, should be removed and a statement reaffirming the conceptual nature of the master plan and its purpose as such should be substituted for that section.
- 3) An acknowledgment should be included in the Park Activities section beginning on page 54, signifying the alignment change of the proposed L. A. County golf course. This alteration would allow for extending a portion of the course across La Cienega Blvd.
- 4) Add a new provision under Public Safety, on page 69, calling for an inter-jurisdictional agreement between all public safety agency representatives from Los Angeles County, Culver City, Inglewood, the city of Los Angeles, and the State of California.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Baldwin Hills Conservancy provide its recommendations to the Secretary of the Resources Agency and the

Director of Parks and Recreation for consideration and inclusion in the master plan to be prepared for submission the California State Legislature.
